Ian Breakspear

“Herbs, Glass Bottles & Poisons in Childers – A Snapshot of Late 19th and Early 20th Century Herbal Medicine”



Having worked as a herbalist in pharmacy, and studied herbal medicines within the Faculty of Pharmacy at the University of Sydney, I have long had a strong interest in the interface between pharmacy and herbal medicine. As such one of my hobbies (when I have time!) is to visit pharmaceutical museums. This talk will be a pictorial conversation based around two visits to the Childers' Pharmaceutical Museum in Queensland, with some additional items of interest thrown in from the History of Medicine Museum at the University of Melbourne. Some fascinating pictures and history will be covered, some amazing old herbal medicines discussed, and even some important NHAA history will be shown.

Ian is a herbalist and naturopath with 20 years of clinical and educational experience, and a Masters degree in Herbal Medicines. Ian's clinical speciality is helping patients with diabetes and heart disease, and he lectures nationally and internationally on these topics. Ian also served for 8 years on the Board of Directors of the NHAA, and was awarded a Fellowship for his contribution to the profession. Ian currently teaches within the Bachelor degree programs at two private colleges, and has many years of educational experience, including 7 years as deputy head of the naturopathy program at the University of Western Sydney, and 4 years as Program Manager of Naturopathy at the Australasian College of Natural Therapies. Most recently during 2013 and 2014, Ian was a member of the Subject Matter Expert Group for Naturopathy and Western Herbal Medicine, which was instrumental in raising the minimum entry level qualification from Advanced Diploma to Bachelor degree.
